These curriculum components are utilized in grades Kindergarten – 1st grade to drive instruction, and academic interventions are being implemented to accelerate positive academic outcomes.

The staff consists of 11 highly qualified teachers, certified paraprofessionals, and student support staff. A key initiative that will continue to be implemented at McMonagle Elementary to increase achievement is the use of our new Curriculum (Benchmark Advance) for reading and new math curriculum (SAAVAS). These curriculum components are being used in grades First – Sixth to drive instruction, and common core assessments will be created to accelerate positive academic outcomes.

For the 2019-2020 school year, the requirement for an updated SIP was waived by the state, and we have moved to the new MICIP process starting the 2020/2021 school year.

Hamady Middle School's school improvement plan can be accessed on our website with other documents. It is updated annually. Our school improvement plan focuses on increasing achievement in reading, writing, and mathematics proficiency. To address these gaps, Hamady Middle School has created goals, strategies, and activities through the AdvancED School Improvement process. In each core academic area, strategies and activities have been designed to not only improve academic achievement for all students but specifically for students in the lowest 30% in achievement level. It is our hope that the strategies and activities will be successful to ensure higher levels of student academic excellence.

We have supporting classes for students who struggle in core areas. We have both Math and Literacy Coach, and Paraprofessionals. Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) continue to lead school improvement by setting school wide goals and completing department tasks. This year our improvement team continues to develop PSAT 8 test-taking strategies, along with MSTEP and PSAT 8 prep review sessions in all core areas. Department chairs were also

responsible for mentoring members of their department in designing and mapping out curriculum in their subject areas. While we are pleased to have reached last year's goals, we will still work towards continuous improvement by setting new goals.

- I. Students who live within the designated school boundaries are able to attend Hamady Middle School. Families who are not residents of the Westwood Heights School District may apply for *Out of District Schools of Choice*. Please contact the district registration office for assistance.
- II. Hamady Middle School continues to review student performance data and make the necessary adjustments to ensure that all students are achieving. The focus of the school improvement plan is to increase the percentage of our students who score proficiently in English, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies on the MSTEP and PSAT 8 tests. Another focus is on ensuring that all students are involved with engaging enrichment programs.

Hamady Middle School, along with the entire Westwood Heights School District, received district wide full accreditation from the AdvancED School Accreditation Program during 2016-2017 school year.

- III. Hamady Middle School provides instruction for students in grades 7-8th. Currently, Hamady Middle School offers Honors Classes in all core areas and also Algebra I in 8th grade. We provide all students an enrichment experience after school through the 21st Century After School Program.
- IV. Hamady Middle School has worked diligently to incorporate the state core curriculum, including the Common Core Standards for ELA and Math along with the Michigan standards

and benchmarks, in other areas of the district's curriculum offerings. Core curriculum areas necessitating such attention include: Social Studies, Science, Health, Physical Education, and Technology.

It is updated annually our school improvement plan focuses on increasing achievement in reading, writing, and mathematics proficiency. In addition, we strive to increase the number of college and career ready students prepared to enter the 21st century workforce. To address these gaps, Hamady High School has created goals, strategies, and activities through the AdvancED School Improvement process. In each core academic area, strategies and activities have been designed to not only improve academic achievement for all students but specifically for students in the lowest 30% in achievement level. It is our hope that the strategies and activities will be successful to ensure higher levels of student academic excellence.

The focus of the school improvement plan is to increase the percentage of our students who score proficiently in English, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies on the Michigan Merit Exam. Another focus is on ensuring that all students are involved with engaging enrichment programs.
- 3. Hamady High School provides instruction for students in grades 9-12. We have juniors and seniors attended the Genesee Area Skill Center for a portion of the day.

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF OTHER SPECIALIZED SCHOOL EXPERIENCES

Academy West: Academy West is an alternative high school completion program for those students who have not been successful in the traditional high school setting.

Genesee Career Institute: GCI Technology Center provides career-technical training for 11th and 12th graders who wish to develop specific job skills. Approximately 40 different career-technical courses are taught at the GASC Technology Center.

GenNET: The Genesee Network for Education Telecommunications is a fiber optic network that provides integrated voice, video, and data communication technology. Students can take unique classes from teachers in other districts without ever leaving Grand Blanc.

Virtual Classes: GBHS offers Internet classes from a variety of sources

with different formats. The classes may be accessed from a home or school computer. Students may work on their online classes at times that fit their school and/or personal schedule.

- 4. Hamady High School has worked diligently to incorporate the state core curriculum, including the Common Core Standards for ELA and Math along with the Michigan standards and benchmarks, in other areas of the district's curriculum offerings. Core curriculum areas necessitating such attention include: Social Studies, Science, Health, Physical Education, Foreign Language and Technology. The plan can be accessed in the main office.
- 5. The aggregate student achievement results for the High School. The NWEA for the Fall of 2022- 9th grade- 61% of students met their Math Growth Projection/81% met their Reading Growth Projection, 10th grade- 50% of students met their Math Growth Projection/73% met their Reading Growth Projection, 11th grade- 57% of students met their Math Growth Projection/92% met their Reading Growth Projection, 12th grade-84% of students met their Math Growth Projection/96% of students met their Reading Growth Projection.
- 6. Hamady High School prides itself with communicating with parents during the parent/teacher conferences. In an attempt to meet with every parent, Hamady High School teachers extend themselves by conferring with parents by other means such as phone conferences and face-to-face meetings during unscheduled conferences. (60%)
- 7. A. Currently, Hamady High School has 21 students enrolled in postsecondary courses.
 - **B**. The number of college equivalent courses offered. We offer (1) AP class and (1) dual enrollment class.
 - C. We currently have 25 students enrolled in college equivalent courses.
 - **D.** We currently have 21 students receiving a score leading to college credit.

We believe all students can learn; therefore, we will establish high standards and create an environment that engages our students in academic work, resulting in academic excellence.

Hamady High School students were also successful outside of the classroom. The girls and boys basketball teams continue to perform at district and state championship levels. Our boys wrestling and football teams are still performing at a high level. In addition, a large number of students have received scholarships towards their college experiences, both in state and out-of-state universities. A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Academy West was identified as a Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school based on 2021-22 data. The school was identified as performing in the lowest 5% of schools on the state. Academy West has operated as a C.S.I. school partnering with the Genesee Intermediate School District since the beginning of the 2017-18 school year.

The results from the school index report were used to drive the development of the school improvement plan. The plan identifies annual measurable objectives that will serve as strategic targets as well as strategies that will be used to reach those targets. Three key areas have been identified as areas of need for Academy West students. Math proficiency and growth, reading proficiency and growth and graduation rate are the focus areas for the program. Specific strategies in place to address each of these priorities include:

- · Staff professional development on educating at-risk students
- · Student mentoring
- · Identifying cohort groups to help remove barriers to on-time graduation
- · Enrichment Fridays to build the whole student
- · Four-day school week with extra time for tutoring and one-on-one instruction
- · Instructional support from the Genesee ISD math and ELA coaches
- · CSI intervention support staff

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Students are referred to Academy West Alternative for a variety of reasons. Students who are deficient in credits or who have had their education interrupted for any reason can benefit from the alternative schedule and curriculum that Academy West offers. Some students choose to enroll here that may feel out of place at traditional high schools. Students do not need to reside in-district to attend. To enroll parents/guardians fill out enrollment papers, records request form, home language survey, and provide a copy of birth certificate, transcripts, and behavior report. Please contact the office at (810) 591-0123 for assistance.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The Academy West school improvement plan is updated regularly to continue to meet the needs of our students and improve the areas of needed growth while following State and district guidelines. Our goals include:

- · Improving reading comprehension and growth
- · Improving math proficiency and growth
- · Increasing our graduation rates
- · Providing a safe and healthy learning environment
- · A well-rounded education involving all core areas and enrichment activities.

Academy West offers two programs, our traditional on-site blended learning environment with teacher led instruction as well as Westwood Virtual Academy, a partnership with MyVirtual Academy in which students complete virtual courses through a board approved online program.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

Academy West Alternative High School does not have any specialized schools.

Academy West students are functioning below the county and state levels in all academic areas on the S.A.T and M-Step Assessments. Specific strategies are being implemented to address these areas of need.

Academy West has limited participation at Parent-Teacher conferences. Parents at conferences represent less than 10% of our students. To accommodate this, teachers make weekly parent contacts for students who are struggling academically or behaviorally.

7. FOR HIGH SCHOOLS, ONLY ALSO REPORT ON THE POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENTS (DUAL ENROLLMENT and AP/IB)

Academy West does not offer dual enrollment or AP/IB classes at this time.
